The one-day workshop fills a gap in the education of members and doctors interested in phlebology. The design of the program is to provide delegates with an overview of interventional techniques in current practice and a snapshot of emerging technologies and procedures. The program aims to cover all the key topics in interventional phlebology and information on further training and skilling in phlebology is also provided in the afternoon symposium.

Symposium 1: venous intervention

Symposium 2: training, accreditation, medicolegal

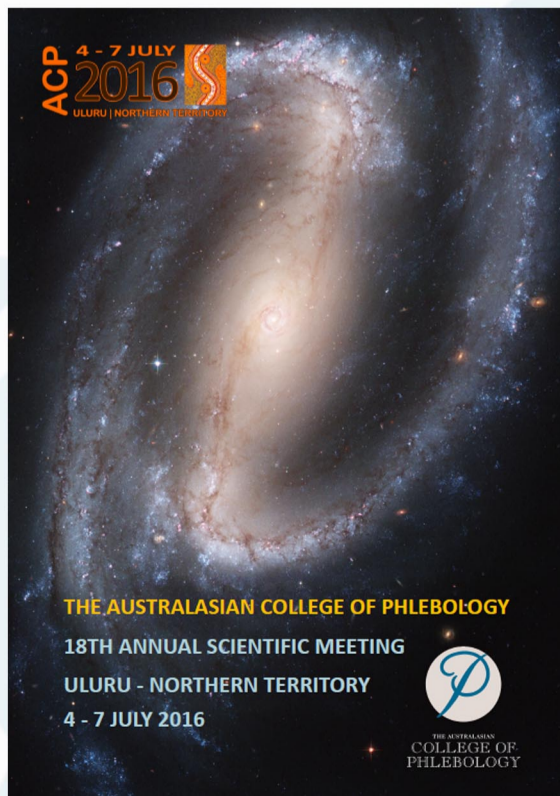
